On Saturday, August 1, 1981, at 12:01 a.m. eastern time, MTV appeared on the air with the words:

"Ladies and gentlemen, rock and roll."

It was a life-changing event. Oh, I know the invention of the wheel and the discovery of fire were big too, but dammit, these were 24-hours-a-day music videos.

Our favorite rock stars fluffed up their hair nice and big, started wearing makeup, and tried to learn how to dance. Suddenly, we began to care how Paul Simon looked.


aired! Remember, we do this for you, so you don't have to. Here is part two.



6. We Don't Talk Anymore- Cliff Richard (1979)

I love Cliff Richard and this tune. This guy was like Elvis Presley in England. He was mostly only like Cliff Richard in the US. Only The Beatles and Elvis Presley sold more records in the U.K. A lifelong bachelor, he is 79 now, still playing, and complaining of ageism in the music industry.


7. Brass in Pocket- The Pretenders (1979)

The 68-year-old Hynde released a new record, *Stockholm*, in 2014. The band has been through numerous personnel changes, but Chrissie Hynde remains a constant.

8. Time Heals- Todd Rundgren (1981)

A cool new-wave Todd tune with computer effects, "Time Heals" disappeared from MTV's rotation with amazing speed. That's a shame because Rundgren spent a pile of cash producing it. Oh well, Todd was ahead of his time, but he is still Todd; a quirky, restless genius living in Hawaii and playing with Ringo Starr & His All-Starr Band.

9. **Take It on the Run**- REO Speedwagon (1981) This was a so-so power ballad with crunchy guitars and an earnest

Kevin Cronin vocal. It was technically the 9th video to air on MTV but something screwed up and it went to black in 12 seconds and didn't return. REO Speedwagon sells few records these days but is popular on the concert trail.
